



Aircraft technology is evolving to tackle the most important challenges of our time


Aviation contributes around 2% of all human-induced carbon dioxide emissions.

Major airlines have committed to being carbon neutral by 2050.

Today's new aircraft are ~85% more efficient than the early jet planes of the 1960s, and ~20% more efficient than the models they are replacing¹.

The future of sustainable aviation will be enabled through use of Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF), operational and technical improvements, and new propulsion technologies.

We are working with stakeholders to enable this transition.




The future is clean

We are working with providers to secure sustainable aviation fuel supply.








Freight

Direct international freight connections enable the region's high value export industries. These industries support thousands of workers from Cardwell to the Torres Strait. Regional Trade Distribution Centre (RTDC) will support freight exports. By prioritising airfreight infrastructure development we are supporting future airfreight growth.





Emergency Services Base

Cairns Airport is an advantageous location to base operations servicing Northeast Australia and our Pacific neighbours.

A number of emergency service operators have bases on Cairns Airport.

We intend to create an aeromedical and emergency precinct on Cairns Airport to provide optimal operating conditions for these critical services as our region continues to grow.
